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ABSTRACT

In overall conclusion, this research was conducted to spending behaviour among college students in Miri. For this research, the researcher adopted quantitative method and the collection was through self-designed questionnaire to get the research data. The data are collected and analyse using simple statistic method. The findings of this research have revealed that usually spending most on foods. Second finding shows that majority of the respondents usually spending almost 61% to 80% per month. The third findings show that respondent get the pocket money too often from their parents. The fourth findings is that most of the respondent source of income is from their parents. Form the findings, the researcher suggest several recommendations for implemented. The recommendation college students should eat at home and packing their won lunches before off to school instead having a lunch at restaurant or “Kopitiam”. Besides that, College students may set the budget for limit the expenses of some unnecessary income such as spending based on self-satisfaction and be a conscious consumer to know where the money spend. Moreover than that, college students also can work instead of the pocket money that given by parents. Lastly, the future research could explore equally the population of racial groups in Miri toward spending behaviour. Besides that, future research can investigate the spending behaviour among young adult in whole Malaysia.
